I feel like we are coming to the close of the calm before the storm period for much of our administration type action. Our contracts for insurance, reciprocals and storage are all due for renewal this month or next.

Reciprocals

Our partner club, 19 Wing, has formally indicated that they are fully on board for another season of sharing of the cost for incoming reciprocal boats by matching our budgeted amount of \$2,200. Over the next month or so we will be confirming our list of reciprocal clubs so that they are all in place before the cruising season begins. If you have any destinations that you would like us to consider for reciprocity please let me know and the Executive can review the suggestions. At this point we don't anticipate any changes from our prior years' lists.

Insurance

Last month I mentioned our Stewardship program insurance which is paid for by the BC Government. This covers our liability issues during Tree Island activities. This month our own Directors and Officers and Liability insurance is up for renewal. As you likely find in your own home, our premium is up another 9.5% this year to \$2,300. This covers us for up to \$2M liability and extends to all sailing and social activities approved by the Club. It does, however, specifically exclude coverage for any abuse or harassment allegations.

Storage

Not a very exciting topic but a necessity for the Club with our collection of Tree Island gear, cookout supplies and equipment, open house tent and other things collected over the years. The Club rents a storage locker at one of the local storage locations to house those things.

Communications

The Club is still looking for assistance in the area of managing our Club photo collection and for people to assist with the Club history section of our records. If you have interest in either the **Photo Album Editor** or being part of the **Club History Committee**, please contact any member of the Executive so that we can get this work off the ground.

The Council of BC Yacht Clubs held a meeting in February. Some of the items that might be of interest to us were:

BC Marine Parks Forever: There will be few if any additional stern ties installed this year as BC Parks still has not made a commitment either for locations or funding. BCMPFS is waiting for approval from BC Parks to add a highly visible yellow plastic square (6" x 6") to every currently installed site. Many pins and chains blended into the rock face to which they were attached, rendering them almost invisible.

In 2019 BCMPFS participated in two land purchase deals totaling \$150,000; \$100,000 in Octopus Islands Marine Park and \$50,000 in Princess Louisa Marine Park. (This was "seed" funding enabling the purchase of land from private owners that was then incorporated into these parks.)

Charts: Canada will continue to produce paper charts and will not follow US lead in ceasing production of paper charts.

If you are interested in seeing the Minutes in their entirety, they are on our Club website in the Members Only section. My husband Jack Reynolds and I are your Club representatives to the Council, but we are unable to make the meeting on April 25th in Nanaimo. If you are interested in attending, please let me know.

Are you itching to get out on the water this spring? I know I am. With only a few more tasks to complete, Marny's Dream will soon be ready to be led back down to the Salish Sea!



As always drop us a line with any feedback or suggestions. We are here for you!


