Reciprocal Agreements – I've forwarded the signed Reciprocal Agreements to our partner clubs. While we are waiting for responses, I'm sure you can ask for reciprocal privileges from now on. Be sure to keep a photocopy of your "Proof of Liability Insurance" onboard as it is becoming increasingly necessary to provide it when using reciprocal privileges or docking at harbours run by municipal authorities.

Website Manager – Still looking for a back-up person to help Glenn with the website. **Please** consider volunteering!! Contact Glenn for more information.

Interclub Meetings – Jack and I attended the <u>Council of BC Yacht Clubs</u> meeting at the Capital City Yacht Club on April 14th. Once again I was blown away by the good work this body is doing on our behalf.

AIS permits in Washington state – one of our Council representatives regularly meets with the corresponding body from Washington State and he reported a new tax boaters are required to pay to enter Washington waters (salt or fresh). You must pay for an Aquatic Invasive Species Prevention Permit – US\$24. To learn more, see this website: https://wdfw.wa.gov/licensing/ais_prevention/. Note that the federal customs officers may not be aware of this permit requirement. State fisheries officers will be inspecting for the permits and during this inaugural year you will be given 5 days to purchase a permit if you are stopped and found to be without one.

BC Marine Parks Forever Society – George Creek, the President, managed to get a 30 minute meeting with the provincial Minister of Environment, George Heyman – quite an achievement. He talked about the value of recreational boating to the provincial economy (huge!), and the debris on beaches and the ocean bottom from active and inactive aquaculture sites. He also handed over a cheque for \$750,000 raised by the Society for the purchase of Harmony Island to add it to the provincial marine parks system.

Vacant private buoys – I volunteered to run a project over this summer to put some parameters around the problem with anchorages clogged with vacant private buoys. If the responses indicate there is an interest in dealing with this, the Council may decide to determine a process to attempt to resolve the issue. Please see the poster following - and please help out.

Minutes – You'll see the complete Minutes of the Council's meeting on our website under the "Member's Only" drop down menu, "Photos and Reports". There is information about geoduck harvesting in Squirrel Cove (unmarked netting on the bottom), their opposition to the Port Harvey barge shipyard, and more.

Mooring Buoy Proliferation Problem

At the recent Council meeting it was decided that, before attempting to address the problem of mooring buoys cluttering up anchorages and harbours, the first step should be to identify the actual scope of the problem. Jenifer Reynolds, from Comox YC, has taken on the task of organizing this. The message below is from her. It is being sent to all Council members, and also to all Yacht Clubs directly. Please encourage the members of your club to participate.

In order to determine if vacant private mooring buoys, either legal or illegal, are unduly restricting anchoring in popular anchorages, the Council of BC Yacht Clubs is requesting your help during the 2018 cruising season. To ask your club members to participate, could you please forward the attached information to them? (click here to open the attachment). It is a few simple questions that can be sent by email to the Council when one of your members encounters an anchorage clogged by buoys.

As well as random reports, your yacht club may wish to concentrate on a few anchorages that are close to home. That would also be useful data for us.



- Pick up the Host Kit and head to the Island on Friday afternoon. You get to use the CVYC Mooring buoy for the whole weekend (Fri Sun)! Identify your boat with the Park Host banners.
- Go ashore mid afternoon each day with brochures (in the Kit), a garbage bag for any trash, and TP for the out houses. Meet and greet visitors, answer questions. You'll have a BC Parks vest, shirt, or hat if you want to use them. As a Host you're not required to admonish those with loose dogs, or campfires, etc. We are not Wardens.
- Take your dingy around to anchored boats with brochures to pass out.
- Fill out our Log sheets (in the Kit) regarding the number of visitors and boats, as well as any comments you have.
