Council of BC Yacht Clubs Report

Henry Bay News: Peter Stockdill is a retired medical doctor who lives in Schooner Cove. He is an active member of the Council, keeping an eye on applications up and down the Coast which may impact upon the use of waterways by recreational and other boaters. (He is also the fellow that started tracking US vessels in our waters this past spring.)

Recently Peter consulted CVYC regarding an application to extend the shellfish operation at Henry Bay from 5.8 ha to 16.7 ha. Of particular concern was a remark by Transport Canada that "more recent charts do not list it as an anchorage".

Several members of the Club were contacted to comment, and, as a result, Peter was able to provide advice as to the navigation lights that should be required. Further, thanks to our input, Transport Canada advised that "the Canadian Hydrographic Service has initiated the process to have the anchorage added to Chart 3527 to better match the Sailing Directions". That felt good!








Please welcome our two new members Danny and Gaynor Bereza and their PV "Caviar". We were happy to see them at the TGIF on Jan 8th.

With a mix of boats, skippers and Admirals we needed a unifying flag to sail under – a burgee! The Club held a design contest open to all members to submit their ideas.


